If we look closely at a meal we will see that it is something we all need and have in common. Many of our best memories are of family meals on festive occasions like Christmas or a wedding. Sharing a meal with others involves slowing down, taking time out to engage them in conversation and find out what is happening in their lives. Meals are not just about consuming food and banishing hunger. They can also nurture the soul by offering enjoyment, providing hospitality, creating friendships, developing relationships, spawning community and signalling reconciliation. It is said that we can never really be enemies with someone with whom we have a meal.

The Church has always regarded the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes as a sign pointing to the Eucharist. Jesus wanted to feed his followers in a spiritual manner by means of the Eucharist. The taking and breaking of bread, the blessing and distributing of fish symbolised the Messiah sharing a meal with his people, satisfying their human needs and providing them with nourishment for earthly and eternal life. The deepest yearnings of the human heart can find fulfilment only in God who is patiently guiding us through the shadows of this life towards the glowing reality of heaven. In the celebration of the Eucharist, Jesus comes to us as our pilgrim food in the form of bread and wine and satisfies our hunger for all that is most precious in life.
