Dear Parishioners

Today's Feast of All Saints is a feast of encouragement, celebrating that we are called to be saints. The biblical meaning of 'saint' is a person who is trying to live a life of holiness for the Lord. Our modern idea has restricted the term to those who are in heaven. Just the same we still use the term 'Communion of Saints' to refer to the union of all members of Christ in the Church militant here on earth and the Church suffering in purgatory, as well as the Church triumphant in heaven. The “communion” or “fellowship” which we have with each other comes from our union with God. We do not come together to form a community and then begin to worship. Rather, we come to worship, and by that worship we are formed into a community. And we must always see our Communion of Saints in the context of Christ. Only through, with and in him do we have communion with each other and with the saints in heaven. So we should not visualise our relationship with the saints as their being so many functionaries through whom we must go to get to the boss. Our relationship with the saints is a circle, not a hierarchical bureaucracy. The saints intercede for us, just as we intercede for each other.
