Dear Parishioners

To obtain the life of Jesus from the bread he gives, we must first believe in his word that he himself is in the bread. This is the belief of the Church which she has never changed. Even the threat and revolt of Luther against it did not shake her faith. In the first century, Christians said this, the church of the Middle Ages said this, the pre-Vatican church said this and the post-Vatican church also says the same. The church cannot really explain it. A little boy asked the electrician: "What exactly is electricity?" The electrician said: "I don't really know, son, but I can make it give you light." Likewise, the Church cannot really explain how Jesus is in the Eucharist, but she can make it give us the life of Jesus. If we believe in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, we will receive his life from it and that life will provide us with the strength needed to sustain our life's trials. Not only that. With his life, we will also be able to "get rid of all bitterness, all passion and anger, harsh words, slander, and malice of every kind, following the way of life, even as Christ loved us." Thus, with hearts filled with Christ's own love, we will be able daily to take from our own hearts a few cups of love and one teaspoon of patience, one tablespoon of generosity, one pint of kindness, and one quart of laughter, mix it up, stir it well and then spread it over the span of a lifetime and serve it to others.
