The Trinity is a mystery – probably the most profound mystery of Christianity. There are, however, two key elements in this mystery that the human mind can grasp.

The first is the fact that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are distinct, different from one another. They are unique individuals. God has told us that it is proper to attribute to Him, the Father, the work of creation, to God the Son, the work of Redemption, of reconciling. And to the Holy Spirit, the work of guidance in truth, of teaching. The second feature about the Trinity that is understandable, is that while each person is different from the other, those three persons live in community. God is a family.

Sacred Scripture says that you and I are made in the image and likeness of God. So it is not surprising that you and I have the same two qualities of God that I have just described. First, we have a craving to be unique, to be ourselves, to be different, to make our own special imprint on history. We don't want to be clones. We want to be seen and accepted as special individuals. Second, like God we have the tendency to want to be in community. We are social beings; we want to live with others.

And so, fundamentally, in the core of our being we are like God, for the simple reason that the same qualities which exist in God are found in us. We have a drive to be unique, and we have another drive to be in community.

What great gifts we have been given, if only we would always use them wisely!
