**LITURGY** 

First reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

Response to the Psalm: In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon

fails.

**Second reading:** Romans 15:4-9

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, and all mankind shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 3:1-12

This week, in the Gospel, John the Baptist appears announcing God's impending arrival to purify the world. While the Baptiser stresses the need for conversion and warns of the fate of those who do not reform, the first reading, from Isaiah gives us a magnificent vision of the peace, justice and right that will come about through the coming Messiah. The poor will have justice; there will be universal knowledge and prosperity and an end to violence and fear. But while this vision is heart-moving, one wonders whether we can or do still believe it. Most modern people seem to have abandoned the hope for an imminent divine coming; and we are suspicious of utopian visions and prophetic warnings.

But what happens then to our sense of expectation, our Advent hope for God's coming? Is it reduced to a fiction, a cynical commemoration of a **past** expectation that was fulfilled at Christ's birth. Is there anything for **us** to hope for and await? We should remember that we would not be seeking God 'in the Kingdom' unless

God were already present in our hearts; it is precisely because of this divine presence of God 'within' that we can seek and long for God. For the Christian, the peace of God is both a present reality and a promise; and because a promise, also a task and a challenge. The cleansing fire is already here, are willing to allow ourselves to be burned, sifted, transformed, as a sign to the world of the secret presence that is also present within it, waiting to be discovered.
