Gospel: John 11::1-45

Being a good Christian means dying to self. This is a difficult challenge as we are part of a society that promotes self-interest and encourages us to be self-assertive. The pressures encouraging selfishness are stronger than ever. We are plagued with advertisements persuading us to spoil ourselves, pamper our children and be self-indulgent. We aren't even shocked anymore when we read about mothers walking out on their family to pursue their own happiness. How often do we hear the remark: 'It's my life and I have to do what suits me best.' The perception is that this life is all that there is and that death is the end, so make the most of it. Today's Gospel questions such thinking, which is not the way Christ taught us to search for happiness. He states that without the Spirit there is a total absence of life and stresses the importance of genuinely getting to know oneself in order to die daily to sin and selfishness. Each time we overcome our selfishness we are sharing in the newness of life Christ has come to bring.

The Lord is standing at the door of our hearts, seeking an entrance and waiting for us to roll back those boulders which have kept us locked up in a shadowy existence. Christ wants to enter and bring his life-giving presence to those places of darkness, shame and even death. The good news is that he sets free those who are bound by sin and can bring back people to life no matter how long they have been dead to the things of the spirit. He is calling us to face the shadows, to come into the sunshine and walk in the fullness of life.
