Together with Jesus, we enter Holy Week at Jerusalem. But this entry would turn out to be unique and momentous. The entry was made by Jesus, humble, with a pair of beasts of burden, yet it gathered shouting crowds in front and behind him. For some this might have been a parody or reversal of the triumphal entry of kings and emperors, for some it could have announced that the restoration of the Davidic kingdom was at hand, for others a symbolic statement was being made that here indeed was a ruler but with a new. redefined kind of authority. And we Christian believers need constantly to deepen our own faith, and help those who in different ways still ask about Jesus Christ: who is this? The answer is shattering in its power. Jerusalem quaked when Jesus entered it, the earth would quake as Jesus died, and there was a strong earthquake as the angel descended onto the empty tomb. The impact of Christ's life, death and resurrection is without precedent. The good news of salvation must not be tamed. Jesus Christ has a sovereign authority not known before on earth; he reigns with the kind of power that is a unique love. He makes a difference to everyone and to everything. The bible's last book, the *Apocalypse*, keeps before us the sight of a new heaven and a new earth. There is a holy city too, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God.
