A variety of tests are undertaken every year to determine many things. There are intelligence tests, even though there isn't general agreement on what intelligence is. There are tests of poverty, even though the meaning of poverty varies from culture to culture, country to country, time to time and person to person.

Jesus didn't need tests to show that the intellectuals, those who were at the top of the socio-economic level, and the leaders of the people were rejecting him and the humble people accepting him. Saint Matthew begins today's collection of Jesus' sayings with Our Lord's observation that the humble folk were God's kind of people; Jesus the carpenter was one of them. The message does not condemn intellectual pursuit or achievement. No, intellectual pursuit is praiseworthy, and our Church communities need more of it. What Jesus is condemning is intellectual *pride*. He's not connecting faith and *ignorance*, but faith and *lowliness*: this consists of simplicity, openness and trust — the kinds of virtues we observe in a child (and in *mature* adults). Jesus is saying that it's not by understanding alone that one accepts His message, but by divine revelation. That revelation isn't denied to so-called 'wise and learned' people — provided they're at the same time humble, open and trusting

If we find that there are memorials that are unsafe, we will first contact the family so that they can make appropriate repairs at their own cost. However, if any such work is not completed within 6 months, we will arrange for the memorial to be laid flat and charge accordingly. All work must be carried out by a licensed stonemason, details of which can be obtained from the Parish office.
