Today's extract from Paul's lovely letter of joy to the Philippians - the last this year - shows the paradox of serenity in the midst of trouble. Paul had experienced life as it is for many of us: a mixture of poverty and plenty, joy and sadness, the valley of darkness as well as green pastures. Now he was in jail, knowing that any false move meant immediate death. The Philippians, hearing of Paul's problem, had sent Epaphroditus and financial help to sustain his needs. Paul here expressed his thanks but, paradoxically, communicated that he wasn't dependent upon their gift, and was serene. His serenity wasn't because of his own strength but, even in his current life-threatening situation, was because he had discovered the paradox that the Lord's power is made perfect in weakness. Paul was proud to be Godsufficient, instead of *self*-sufficient as others preached. As a *true* follower of Christ he joyfully accepted God's invitation to His party, at the same time realising that, as with the Eucharist, to share a meal is to accept a commitment to the person whose quest we are. In whatever hardship happens to us, we pray the beautiful words of today's Responsorial Psalm: "The Lord is my shepherd." That can provide us with the paradox of true serenity even in a sea of trouble.
