#### **Dear Parishioners**

Contrary to the manner in which it is often celebrated in churches, Advent begins not on a note of joy, but of despair. Humankind has reached the end of the rope. All our schemes for self-improvement, for extricating ourselves from the traps we have set for ourselves, have come to nothing. We have now realised at the deepest level of our being that we cannot save ourselves and that, apart from the intervention of God, we are totally and irretrievably lost.

Thus Advent serves a dual purpose. On the one hand, it is the culmination of virtually half the church year in which, liturgically, we have celebrated the life of the Spirit. During this time we have been reminded of our responsibility to do the work of the kingdom. But in spite of the very best intentions of the people of God we realise that the world has yet to be redeemed. So the prayer of Advent is that Christ will soon come again to rule over God's creation in power and in justice. On the other hand, Advent also takes us back to the beginning of things. Back to that time so long ago when men and women of faith yearned for the first coming of the Saviour. The season thus attempts to capture that spirit of hope in the midst of hopelessness.

Saint Mark tells us to "Be on your guard, stay awake..." Watchfulness is necessary, according to Saint Mark, because only God knows what time it is. As the people of God wait even now, they can anticipate only that the times are in God's hands and not their own. They know that God will not leave them alone, that God will not leave them without hope.

So let us prepare for the coming of Christ let us watch and wait. Let us pray that as we prepare for Christ's birth our hearts may be filled with his love, a love that we can share with one another, for it is only through this love that we can be saved.
