**Second reading:** Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! We saw his star as it rose and have

come to do the Lord homage. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

Taken together, the three gifts brought by the wise men reveal both who the child Jesus is and what he is destined to do. We might describe them as token gifts in the best sense: they betoken or symbolise something more than their immediate use; they point us to a deeper future significance beyond any immediate utility. You see, the Epiphany is not about the wise men whose names we don't know for sure, nor is it even about their gifts which Jesus certainly didn't need even if they are richly symbolic. No, the Epiphany is really about Jesus, whose name we do know and which means 'God saves'. Jesus saves Kings as well as Shepherds, the wise and the simple, both righteous and sinners; yes, even you and me. That's His incomparable gift to us. Christina Rosetti memorably suggested the only fitting response:

What can I give him,
Poor as I am?
If I were a shepherd
I would give a lamb;
If I were a wise man
I would do my part;
But what I can I give him
Give him my heart.
