#### **Dear Parishioners**

On a number of occasions people have said to me to me, "I don't know why I go to Mass Father, I don't get anything out of it." Well, you're wrong. We're going to be here through the whole worship time and we really are wasting time if we don't just think of our God, recognise that he has given us unbounded blessings, has given us food to eat, a great home to live in and freedom to practice our religion and not be persecuted when we do. Think about the many other areas of the world whose people don't have what we have. They don't have freedom, they don't have enough food or housing, they often don't have the means of a great education.

I think it is very important for all of us, particularly our young people, to realise what God has given us, all of us could have been born in other countries but, for some reason he chose that we would be here where there is freedom, where no-one need starve and where we have the opportunity to become successful and live our lives as we choose.

And the most important gift we have been given was contained in the Gospel acclamation: "God loved the world so much that he gave his only son; everyone who believes in him has eternal life."

All I can say is, go to Mass for an hour a week because you are getting a great deal in return.
