Dear Parishioners

THE LORD IS RISEN INDEED ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA.

If the Resurrection were just a happy ending, it would be no more than a reversal: an undoing of an evil that had occurred. But we can't reverse things. The Resurrection is not simply Christ coming back to life. Resurrection is not resuscitation. Easter Sunday doesn't pretend Good Friday never happened, because the Risen Christ still bears the wounds of his crucifixion! It is because life is so good that death is so terrible. And only by taking death seriously can we take the Resurrection seriously. The Resurrection does not pretend our lives were nothing; it doesn't pretend that the body is accidental to who and what we are. The Risen Christ bears His wounds, and they are no longer marks of weakness or pain, but of the glory of God.

The Resurrection is not a *turning back* of time; it is a *stepping out* of time. It is the complete triumph over death. Because of the Resurrection we can mourn our dead, but with hope, for God will wipe away every tear. "For I know that my redeemer liveth, and though worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God." We often imagine ourselves pursuing an elusive God, trying to find him as the treasure in the field. The message of the Resurrection is that he finds us. The seekers at the tomb could not find him until he found them. Redemption is allowing oneself to be found by God.
