Dear Parishioners

THE LORD IS RISEN INDEED ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA.

When we consider what makes a good friend, at a human level this means someone who is there when we need them. Δ friend is someone we can talk to in good times and bad times, generally someone who is dependable and understands us, because many things are shared in a friendship. A good friend is someone who would go the extra mile to help us in a time of need, and someone who offers gifts and not expecting anything in return. A friend is someone who makes you feel energised after talking to them, someone you can speak in complete confidence and assurance. Friendship with God should perhaps resemble what makes a good friendship at a human level, but we are not dealing with just any friend request. Δ friendship with God is something which is not going to end over time. When Jesus says 'I call you friends and no longer slaves or servants', this is not really the same thing as a human friendship. A friendship with God might mean that we do end up changing, although that is not the same as manipulation. This friendship with God is also inevitably elusive, as it invites us to fulfil the commands of Jesus to become friends and to remain friends into eternity, whatever that might mean. Love for others is central to this friendship, and love is what ultimately bridges the gap between us and God. Love for others is what makes us able to be friends with our creator.
