### Dear Parishioners

. Today we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. Pentecost celebrates that great event, when the Holy Spirit made known to all peoples the one true God and created from the many languages one united voice to profess the true faith in God. Pentecost shows us that, as the mission of Jesus was universal, so the membership of God's holy Church is universal. Christ is much more than 'my personal Saviour' because His mission transcends a merely individual relationship. His mission is to all peoples of the earth.

It is our task to carry on the work of the Holy Spirit in God's holy church. Jesus is living in us through the power of the Holy Spirit. We received the gift of the Holy Spirit in baptism and confirmation and it is encouraging us to do good works for the life of the Church. In the second reading today, it says: "There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them."

This means that our God given talents are to be used for the building up of the body of Christ, the Church. God does not give us gifts just for ourselves. To each person a different gift is given. We must discover what our abilities are and use them for the glory of God and for our own happiness. If we use the gifts that God the Holy Spirit gives us, we will develop the fruits of the Holy Spirit and these fruits are; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self control.

Let us earnestly pray that the Holy Spirit will animate us to do things, great or small, for God's holy Church and for the world. Let us say repeatedly the Church's prayer, "Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they will be created and you will renew the face of the earth."
