Most of us have probably felt in some way the sentiments expressed in a song like "Sunrise, Sunset" from the musical 'Fiddler on the Roof;' Parents wonder at how quickly the years have flown, how their children have grown. It seems only yesterday they were babies; suddenly it seems they are adults and living their lives of their own. The opposite also happens: the parents whom we always thought of as young and strong and vital are suddenly old or infirm. Or we discover our own mortality and the loss of youth and possibilities. Even in youth we have experienced the seemingly endless summer become an instant, and we wonder where it went so quickly when we face the new school year in September! In whatever context we are all familiar with the sense of time flying: seeing something in its beginnings, and suddenly – so it seems – being confronted with a full-blown reality; the time in-between not noticed. Today's Gospel evokes just such experiences, but without the sense of melancholy and loss that so frequently accompanies them. On the contrary, Jesus' parables speak of fully joyous events: the surprising abundance of nature, the miracle of growth. We wonder: where did it come from? How such small beginnings produce such results? The kingdom of God, Jesus tells us, is like this: the unspectacular, seemingly insignificant beginnings produce marvels.

Of course, growth does not happen all at once; wisdom does not come at once, nor age, nor maturity, nor love. But we most frequently do not notice the small daily increments; we are too close to them; each single moment of growth is understandable and unsurprising — it is only at the end that we are amazed. The marvel actually happens in front of our eyes, but we do not see it as marvelous until we see the whole. It is not any particular moment, but the whole process, which is astonishing. Each stage produces and explains the next; but the fact of there being growth at all — the fact that things can produce what is beyond themselves — produces wonder and can only be seen as the gift of God.
