

First reading: Numbers 11_25-29

Response to the Psalm: The precepts of the Lord gladden the heart. **Second reading:** James 5:1-6

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! I am the light of the world, says the Lord, anyone who follows me will have the light of life. Alleluia! **Gospel:** Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

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Surely if we are honest, we must admit that we are in danger of becoming like the rich that the letter of St. James speaks about oblivious to the needs of others, living in luxury, lives devoid of eternal significance. And yet, what are we to do? Must we deny the world and its goodness? Are we to pluck out the eye for beauty and cut off the hand of work and progress?

A partial answer, at least, is found in what we do when we come together to celebrate the Eucharist. Prayer is meant to be for us like a great storm: it removes us from the security of everyday reality and puts us in contact with the sacred. We are confronted in prayer, if it is genuine, with what we so easily forget: our finitude, our mortality, our kinship with the earth and with each other; our solidarity with all the joys and sorrows of the world; the sense of purpose to life, its beauty and its progress, in the service of others.

But what of the rest of life, those many moments that are not spent in prayer and are devoid of reflection, lived in the habit of secularity? There is some comfort in the words of the earlier part of today's Gospel: "Anyone who is not against us is with us." The whole of the secular world is "with" God to the extent that it does not actually lead us away from him; it is with him in secret and in implicit ways, in its acts of charity, in its efforts at social order, justice and progress, in its seeking for beauty and truth. Much of what is best in our society is in fact the Christian message of love, appropriated by the world and hidden in secular guise. The Christian's attitude will certainly be to support this reality. But beyond this, there is another task: to bring to attention and reflection the true nature of our world, including its

progress and beauty, but also its sorrows and injustice; to overcome the forgetfulness about the purpose of life, and to be for the world a sign of its own deepest meaning toward that ultimate that we know as God and who lives among us by love of one another.
