Dear Parishioners

Amidst the hullabaloo of the Christmas festivities we must not lose sight of the first Christmas Day and the birth of Christ as a vulnerable infant in the simple trappings of a stable at Bethlehem. Otherwise we are emptying the feast of its original meaning and closing our eyes and ears to the message of the Good News. Just as the angels praised the glory of God made visible in the child Jesus with songs of joy, so too must we. The coming of Jesus among us can change our view of life, restore our sense of self-esteem and enable us to be channels for bringing his love and peace to others. God entering our physical world makes everything in it holy and good and helps us realise that we are people of hope, waiting for something great to break into our lives. The delicate image of a new-born child who came in poverty teaches us that there is greatness in humility, glory in service and power in self surrender.

Then there are those who are poor or alone and those who are under pressure because of some misfortune or personal tragedy. We must think of them in their suffering and make them part of our prayer. Christmas brings the assurance that, no matter how dark are the days, God wants to free us from worry and grant us a peace that the world cannot give. Whatever your circumstances, wherever you are and whoever you are with, I do hope that you are able to find happiness and joy in this Christmas season.
