Dear Parishioners

All three readings this week have a similar theme. They all recount individuals being called to the service of God. Each of the men in these readings was called in a dramatic way and I suppose it's easy for us to say, "Well, if God called me by performing a similar miracle, I would probably accomplish great things as well." The truth is, of course, that God has called each one of us. Maybe we didn't hear His voice or experience some miraculous conversion but, let's face it, neither do most other people. I don't recall Mother Teresa or Pope John Paul, to name just two, ever revealing they had a miraculous calling from God. Most of us aren't in the same league as either of those, but everyone has a call from God.

When I was called to be a monk, I didn't experience any miraculous occurrence. I thought about the possibility, I prayed about it (for a long time), then decided this is what God wanted me to do. Those of you who are married had a call from God, those of you who aren't married have a call from God. The important thing is to create space to listen to that call. You see the important fact is that it's not the call that really counts. It's how each of us reacts and responds to the calling we receive.

It's how each of us reacts and responds to all the situations in our life that determines whether we are truly answering God's call to us.

For us, answering the call may be the courage to kiss one's spouse and say, "I'm sorry." It may be realising that God has given your parents their responsibility to expect reasonable obedience from you. It also may be that you have the responsibility to tell your boyfriend or your friends, "NO."

In Gethsemane Jesus was terrified. He did not want to face the coming ordeal, just as we often do not want to face adversity. We need to summon up all our courage and respond as did the disciples, 'They left everything and followed Him." **We** should too.
